No. 1 — Sansone SINGLE FRENCH HORN in F, three valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.

Built of special polished brass, nickel silver slides, with the new, improved Sansone air-tight rotary valves, improved action, regular size bell, corresponding to the exact intonation— Eb crook supplied at extra charge.

No. 2-SANSONE SINGLE FRENCH HORN in F, E and with quick

change to Eb, four valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.

FOUR VALVE SINGLE FRENCH HORN built in F, E, and Eb.

Here is a French Horn which has been Scientifically Designed and Constructed, with the Aim of Simplifying the problem of teaching the French Horn to Students in Orchestras and Bands. The usual procedure has always been a vexing problem for the music teacher.

We have more than met these requirements. We have solved your problem.

Here is the solution:

OPERATION

The fourth valve is operated by the thumb which lowers the pitch onehalf tone from F to E. The Horn is then in the key of E and is fingered exactly like the F Horn. By keeping the thumb down and turning the quick change key on the fourth slide, the pitch is lowered one whole tone from F to Eb. Now the horn is in the key of Eb and is again fingered exactly like the F Horn. This is most practical for Band Work. Another feature of this instrument is that it can be Muted Without Transposing. To play muted parts in the key of F with the hand, first close the bell up tightly. This will make the horn sound one-half tone higher. By pressing the thumb key, which lowers the pitch one-half tone, the instrument will sound muted in the original key. The same applies when playing the E Horn. By turning the quick change the same method is used. No extra Crooks Are Necessary since everything is operated by hand, using the valves only. This horn has a Complete Range of More Than Three and One-Half Octaves.

THE SANSONE MODEL No. 8

No. 8—SANSONE SINGLE FRENCH HORN in Bb, three valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.

This model horn is ideal for the beginner. Lighter weight and shorter tubing results in easier blowing. Being a fourth higher than the F horn, the high register is more easily obtained. The Bb horn tone is more brilliant and carries better as a solo instrument in band and orchestral work. Technical passages are easier to execute. Fingering chart supplied on request.

THE SANSONE MODEL No. 4 Bb-A

No. 4—SANSONE SINGLE FRENCH HORN in Bb-A-five valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.

Although titled a "single" horn, this instrument really comprises the features of a double horn organized in accordance with the original and unique design of Mr. Sansone and represents the culmination of over forty years of development and improvement. The double horn of conventional construction requires difficult transpositions, and great skill in blending the two horn voices — its advantage lies in its great range and the provision of the B flat horn for easy blowing in the high register and also the low register of the F horn. Mr. Sansone approached the problem from a different point of view in 1914 when this horn was invented by him. To a three valve Bb horn he added a fourth valve effective to provide the FUNDA-MENTAL and HARMONICS of the F HORN. A fifth valve not only provides an E HORN and an A HORN (according to its slide adjustment) but also makes HAND MUTING EASY on the B flat horn, since it provides the necessary ¾ tone lowering. Consequently the instrument is not only entirely as satisfactory as the double horn but offers many advantages not otherwise obtainable.

IMPORTANT FEATURES OF THE HORN INCLUDES: light weight — easy blowing — single valves, exhibiting less tendency to leak — complete range of four octaves — elimination of transposition for stopped horn (when 5th valve crook is pulled out one inch the horn sounds in B flat when stopped) — provision of E horn without transposition (fourth valve and fifth valve with crook pulled out one inch places horn in E) — provision of A horn (with fifth valve, crook in, horn sounds in A) — provision of harmonic sounds of eleven keys.

Horn is designed to rest on thigh, thus mellowing B flat brilliance to timbre of horn in F.

The fingering, though different from that of the double horn, is basically simpler. Finally this horn is much easier to play, more flexible, and has better intonation than any other. Its virtues have been recognized by many of the world's foremost players. Our superlative valves and richness of timbre combine with other features to make this horn the supreme achievement of the art.

No. 3—SANSONE SINGLE FRENCH HORN in Bb-A, 4 valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.

Using the 4th valve changes the horn to A, to play muted notes without transposition, pull out the 4th valve crook about one inch, close the hand in the bell and depress the thumb valve key.

Very light weight, ideal for high register work.

No. 5—SANSONE DOUBLE FRENCH HORN in F-Bb, four valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.

Originally designed and built by Mr. Sansone in 1920, this horn has undergone many changes since that time — it has a beautiful quality of tone — perfect intonation — finest quality new improved values and workmanship.

It is very hard to notice the difference in tone and intonation when changing from the F horn to the Bb horn.

The Bb horn is built on top of the F horn in order to present a better designed instrument and to eliminate the removal of the F horn crooks in order to get to the Bb horn crooks where water removal is necessary.

THE SANSONE MODEL No. 6 F-E-Bb-A

No. 6—SANSONE DOUBLE FRENCH HORN in F-E, Bb-A, five valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.

This horn can be played in the keys of F, E, Bb and A, four horns in one without any change in fingering, especially useful is the simplicity of fingering in hard technical passages where it is not necessary to use cross fingerings as on the usual type double horn.

By adding the FOURTH VALVE, the MUTED NOTES CAN BE PLAYED WITHOUT TRANSPOSING, or using the ½ tone mute, whether using the F or Bb horn.

If a player desires to mute any note on the regular Bb horn, he will find that muted note is ½ tone sharp — on the model No. 6 horn the muted note will be perfectly in tune by closing tightly the bell with the hand and using the 4th valve, this 4th valve crook must be pulled out about one inch...this is most useful for those who still play the regular double horn and are accustomed to playing certain muted notes some on the F horn and others on the Bb horn.

THE SANSONE MODEL No. 10

No. 10—SANSONE SINGLE FRENCH HORN in F, no valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.


Extra slides in other lower keys supplied on order only at extra cost, built from special brass.

The Hand Horn, about the 17th century, shows the development of metal working, reaching a point where it was found to be more durable in the construction of musical instruments — thus the birth of the Hand Horn, also known as Hunting Horn, Natural, Stopped (hand) Horn — Corno da Caccia (Italian), Cor de Chasse (French), Waldhorn (Germany).

Hand or Natural Horn thus called because various notes can be obtained by the proper use of the hand in the bell in various positions. This horn can be played in many other keys by changing the main crook — the lower octave produces only the Tonic, 5th and 8th (Octave) — the middle and high octave can be played in the scale by using the proper hand position — the RANGE is three octaves but not chromatically — our standard French Horn mouthpiece is supplied with this instrument.

THE SANSONE MODEL No. 8A

No. 8A—SANSONE SINGLE FRENCH HORN in high Bb, Piccolo, three valves, low pitch, American Standard A-440.

Designed and built by Mr. Sansone, originally as a hobby for his grandson. Pitched in high Bb, one octave higher than a regular Bb horn — same pitch as a Bb trumpet — a special mouthpiece is necessary having a shallow cup, is supplied with this instrument.

Wagner's "Siegfried's Call" can be played very easily on this instrument as well as the Bach Cantatas written in the extreme high ranges.
